From our Chapter Educator



The last couple of months I've written a little about the parts of cornering, specifically relaxing a bit before we get into a corner (more to come on that later) and then slowing prior to the corner. The next step is LOOK.

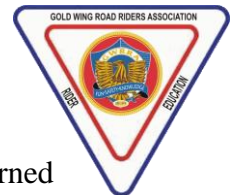
Looking is a big part of most activities. As a golfer I learned early on that you're expected to look at the ball as you swing the club. When my Dad first handed me a rifle to shoot, he talked about where to look in order to hit the target. And we've all heard about distracted drivers, particularly folks texting on their phones...they're NOT looking where they

want to go which leads to problems rather than success. Riding is no exception to the requirement to LOOK, and in our case, we look where we want to go.

One of the biggest things we struggle with in our MSF classes is getting folks to turn their heads to look where they want to go as they think that angling their eyes and using their peripheral vision is good enough. Here's something to try...make a circle out of your thumbs and forefingers at arm's length. Try focusing on what you can see inside that circle. If you're being honest with yourself, you'll agree that anything outside of that circle will be seen only with peripheral vision, and peripheral vision is fuzzy at best. And depending on your age (I hate this part) even part of what is inside the circle may be fuzzy. Fuzzy vision isn't good, but the best way to deal with it is to turn your head and eyes directly into the direction you want to go. Your peripheral vision will add to the visual information you are receiving, but you have to turn your head and not depend only on angling your eyes and fuzzy peripheral images.

Not only do we need to turn our heads so that we can use the sharper part of our vision, but we need to keep our head and eyes level with the horizon. I find that I have to remind myself to keep my head and neck loose so that I can keep my eyes level with the horizon and to maintain the best directional control. When I fail to keep my head and eyes level with the horizon, corners that would otherwise be easily managed become difficult. With my eyes back to level with the horizon, corners become easier.

The next aspect of LOOKING is where to look. Yeah, we look where we want to go, but where exactly is that? I encourage the folks in my MSF classes to think constantly of looking "well ahead". That doesn't mean that they should always look straight ahead way off in the distance. It means we cover the entire spectrum of directions around us in varying distances. Sometimes we look a couple of seconds ahead, sometimes 12



seconds ahead, and sometimes even behind us. In a corner you want to look well ahead...to the exit of the curve or as far around the curve as you can see. It doesn't mean you can't move your eyes around. It means your primary focus should be the exit of the curve.

Get where you want to get in the easiest manner by looking well ahead in the direction you want to go.

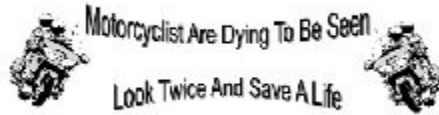
